




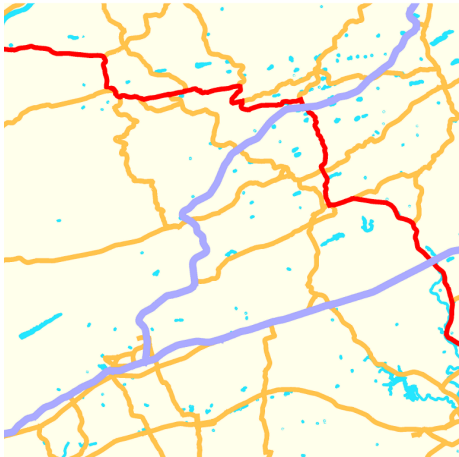

## The Prosecco Tour - Italy

### A Taste Of Venetian Countryside

A UNESCO World Heritage Site, **the Prosecco Hills of Conegliano and Valdobbiadene** unfold across the heart of the Veneto region, nestled at the foothills of the Dolomites. Here, the landscape is a patchwork of rolling hills, **cigioni**—small vineyard plots arranged on narrow grassy terraces—woven together with forests, farmland, and storybook villages such as Serravalle, Arfanta, Pieve di Soligo, and Valdobbiadene. This unique scenery forms the backdrop of the **Prosecco Trail**, one of the most fascinating routes in Italy for lovers of slow, immersive travel.

This network of **prosecco trails** invites you to immerse yourself in the cultural and natural richness of the region. Walking the **Prosecco Trail Italy**, you'll pass centuries-old watermills like the Molinetto della Croda, walk panoramic ridgelines, and descend into quiet valleys cloaked in vineyards—the same vines that produce the world renowned Prosecco Superiore D.O.C.G.

It's more than a hike: **it's a journey through a living landscape**, shaped over centuries by the delicate balance between human craftsmanship and the rhythms of nature.

## Route

### Day 1 Arrival in Vittorio Veneto/Serravalle

Your journey begins in Vittorio Veneto, a peaceful town rich in history and nestled among the gentle hills of northern Italy. Known as the site of the decisive World War I battle that bears its name, the town offers a unique window into Italy's past, surrounded by striking natural beauty.

The historic center is split between **Serravalle and Ceneda**, two charming districts full of character. Wander Serravalle's cobbled alleys and Gothic facades, or explore Ceneda's elegant cathedral and quiet piazzas. All around, the hills are lined with vineyards—a true paradise for wine lovers—with the Prosecco region just moments away.

Whether you're drawn to local heritage, sweeping landscapes, or the call of a nearby trail, **Vittorio Veneto is the perfect place** to start your walk through one of Italy's most scenic and culturally rich regions.

## Day 2 Serravalle loop walk, grotte del Caglieron, 14 km

After breakfast, your journey begins with a scenic walk from the historic heart of Vittorio Veneto, leading you into the gentle slopes of the Prosecco Hills. As you follow quiet country paths, the landscape opens up into a patchwork of vineyards and rustic farmhouses, where every view feels like a postcard.

This tranquil countryside is dotted with small wineries—perfect for a pause to taste the local Prosecco and soak in the atmosphere. The route continues toward one of the area's hidden treasures: the Grotte del Caglieron. A series of cascading waterfalls and sandstone caves carved by centuries of water and time, the grotto offers a cool, shaded escape. Wooden walkways wind through the rocks and streams, with sunlight filtering through the leaves and the sound of water echoing around you.

It's a day that blends nature, beauty, and a touch of adventure—ideal for those who love landscapes shaped by both nature and tradition, with just the right amount of magic in the air.

*Distance: 14 km*

*Elevation Gain: +790/-790m*

## Day 3 Walk from Serravalle to Arfanta, 12,5 km

Begin your walk in the historic center of Vittorio Veneto, then head into the gentle slopes of the Prosecco Hills, where vineyards stretch as far as the eye can see. Enjoy sweeping views, quiet countryside paths, and glimpses of daily life among the vines.

Pause at a local winery for a glass of Prosecco and regional treats before continuing toward Arfanta, a peaceful hilltop hamlet. Surrounded by silence and views that reach the horizon, it's the perfect place to slow down and take it all in.

*Distance: 12,5 km*

*Elevation Gain: +630/-410m*

## Day 4 Loop walk from Arfanta via Molinetto del Croda , 10 km

Start your walk in the charming village of Arfanta, surrounded by the rolling hills of the Prosecco wine region. The path leads you through a patchwork of vineyards, where rows of lush grapevines stretch into the horizon, interspersed with olive trees and rustic farmhouses. Along the way, you can enjoy breathtaking views of the countryside and the distant Dolomites. As you descend, you'll arrive at the Molinetto della Croda, a beautifully preserved 17th-century watermill nestled beside a cascading waterfall. The mill's tranquil setting, surrounded by greenery and the gentle sound of running water, feels like stepping into a storybook. Take a moment to explore the mill's history and admire its picturesque charm. The journey combines the natural beauty of the vineyards with a touch of history, making this a walk to remember. Don't forget to bring your camera—every turn offers postcard-perfect views.

*Distance: 10 km*

*Elevation Gain: +350/-350m*

## Day 5 Walk from Arfanta to Pieve di Soligo, 18 km

Set off on a scenic trail with sweeping views of rolling hills, dotted with cottages and quiet chapels. The path winds through olive groves and wildflowers, immersing you in the peaceful charm of this UNESCO World Heritage landscape. Along the way, you'll pass local wineries, where the scent of fermenting grapes fills the air and tasting opportunities invite you to pause.

The trail gradually leads down to Pieve di Soligo, a vibrant town rich in history and closely tied to the Prosecco tradition. Stroll past elegant buildings, visit the cathedral, and enjoy the riverside promenade. This stage blends nature, culture, and wine—capturing the true essence of the region.

*Distance: 18 km*

*Elevation Gain: +360/-590m*

## Day 6 Walk from Pieve di Soligo to Col San Martino, 14 km

Begin your walk in the charming town of Pieve di Soligo, then follow gentle trails through the heart of the Prosecco Hills. The path winds through rolling vineyards, offering sweeping views and glimpses of daily life among traditional farmhouses and quiet villages. Along the way, you'll pass ancient churches and chapels that add a touch of history to the landscape.

The route leads to Col San Martino, a picturesque village known for its medieval bell tower and stunning views over terraced hills. Stop at a local winery to enjoy a glass of Prosecco and soak in the peaceful beauty of this timeless region.

*Distance: 14 km*

*Elevation Gain: +580/-540m*

## Day 7 Walk from Col San Martino to Valdobbiadene, 12km

Begin your walk in the picturesque village of Col San Martino, heading into the heart of the Prosecco Superiore DOCG region. The trail winds through rolling hills lined with terraced vineyards, offering panoramic views that stretch to the distant mountains. Along the way, you'll pass peaceful hamlets and historic sites like the Romanesque San Vigilio chapel.

The path is dotted with family-run wineries, perfect for a tasting break amid the vines. As you reach Valdobbiadene, vineyards give way to elegant piazzas and lively streets. Known as the capital of Prosecco, the town offers prestigious wineries and cozy trattorias serving local specialties. A perfect blend of scenery, tradition, and flavor—this walk is a sparkling end to your journey.

*Distance: 12 km*

*Elevation Gain: +5300/-420m*

## Day 8 Arrivederci, Valdobbiadene!

The trip and our services end after breakfast, unless you have booked a transfer to the airport or to the train station, or other supplementary services.

## Practical info

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### Arrival – Vittorio Veneto

The tour starts in Vittorio Veneto, a small town in northern Italy. The easiest way to get there is by train from Venice, which is the closest major airport. From Venice Airport, you can take a shuttle or taxi to Venice Mestre train station, then catch a train to Vittorio Veneto (with one change, usually in Conegliano). The full journey takes about 2 to 2.5 hours.

### Departure – Valdobbiadene

The tour ends in Valdobbiadene. From there, you can take a short taxi or bus ride to the nearest train stations like Cornuda or Montebelluna (about 20–30 minutes), and then continue by train to Venice, Treviso, or other major cities.
